PROFOH MATERNAL CARE MISSION AT A GENERAL HOSPITAL IN NIGERIA

Feb- There is something unique about Africa. For the most part and Nigeria in particular, there are two seasons - Rain and Dry season - approximately six month each in a year. During the rain season –there is upsurge of pregnancies. As a result, more deliveries are recorded during the dry season. Three years ago PROFOH conducted a medical mission in Ogbomosho in Oyo State, West of Nigeria. A local midwife approached Dr. Quartemont with a complain. She was tired of taking an average of 20 deliveries per day and asked what could be done to reduce the number of deliveries that occur in her hospital. The doctor schooled her on the reasons behind the upsurge of deliveries during the dry season and suggested that if only she (the midwife) do away with the rain season, there will be a drastic reduction in the number of deliveries. The import of the message was not lost on her.

Our first clinical mission this year was at the Warri Central Hospital. It was primarily to educate women on pre natal care. Lately, there has been an increase in still births and ectopic pregnancies in the region. PROFOH decided on proactive measures to reduce the morbidity and mortality that could arise from these pregnancy-related diseases. We are glad to inform that the project was highly successful as over 20,000 pregnant women benefited from the service. But we regret to note that since the number that turned up far exceeded our expectations, crowd control was poor. At the end, all were served. We were pleased to have been able to serve these women before leaving Warri, Delta State According to WHO, every day, almost 400 women die from causes related to complications of pregnancy and childbirth. Severe bleeding during pregnancy, delivery or after childbirth is the single biggest cause of maternal death and can kill a healthy woman within three hours.

PROFOH MARKS WORLD WATER DAY WITH A PROMISED TO DO BETTER

20th March- PROFOH agrees with UNICEF that access to drinking water has been one of the biggest successes of the Millennium Development Goals. But for 748 million people around the world, just obtaining this essential service remains a challenge. In spite of remarkable progress of access to improved drinking water since 1990, significant disparities persist. Of the 748 million people globally still without access to potable water, 90 per cent live in rural areas, and are being left behind in their countries' progress. For children, lack of access to safe water can be tragic. On average, nearly 1,000 of them die every day from diarrhea diseases linked to unsafe drinking water, poor sanitation, or poor hygiene. For women and girls, collecting water cuts into time they can spend caring for families and studying. In insecure areas, it also puts them at risk of violence and attack. UNICEF estimates that in Africa alone, people spend 40 billion hours every year just walking to collect water. Building on a successful roll-out last year, UNICEF and partners are again this year engaging the public in a social media campaign with the hashtag #wateris, to help raise awareness.

PROFOH MARKED WORLD TB DAY WITH HIGH LEVEL ADVOCACY CAMPAIGN.

24th March- PROFOH, a leading member of WHO STOP TB Partnership. TB is a disease of poverty, it spreads like wildfire through places where nutrition is poor, living conditions are overcrowded, and treatment doesn't exist—infesting and killing millions of people in the poor nations where we work. We can do better. We have to do better. Drug –resistant TB has been a major concern to our organization. With other Partners, we plan to intensify advocacy campaign on TB in Nigeria. We're aiming at helping many more patients with tuberculosis get access to TB drugs. To mark the day, we issued the following statement. "No one should die of a curable disease and yet every 30 minutes someone will die of Tuberculosis. TB is a disease of poverty, which spreads like wildfire through prisons, slums, and shantytowns where nutrition is poor, living conditions are overcrowded, and treatment doesn't exist—infesting and killing millions of people"

UNICEF UK THANK PROFOH FOR MORDERN SLAVERY LAW

26 March- Cull Hayley of UNICEF UK mail to PROFOH reads: Today is a big day. It's a moment to feel proud. This afternoon, the Modern Slavery Bill became law. And it's thanks to you that this new law will really change the lives of trafficked children. When we launched our campaign a year ago, we knew the government's Modern Slavery Bill was a historic opportunity to protect children in danger of trafficking. Yet the draft Bill didn't go far enough to keep children safe. Over the past year, more than 70,000 UNICEF UK campaigners have signed petitions, sent letters, spoken to MPs and raised awareness on social media. You've been passionate and tireless, and the government has taken notice. Meanwhile, we've been busy developing policy and talking to decision-makers to make sure the message gets through.

The final Act that passed today has a much stronger focus on children, and it includes significant measures that wouldn't have been achieved without campaigners like you. Our work does not stop here. There is more that we can and must do to protect children from the danger of trafficking here in the UK and around the world.

In the past, our participation has been very impressive, last year PROFOH was selected a committee member. We look forward to rewarding outing in June.



CHIBOK GIRLS REMEMBERED ONE YEAR AFTER.

14 April-Today marks one year since the tragic kidnapping of over 200 girls from their school in Chibok, north-east Nigeria, and the #BringBackOurGirls campaign that captured the world's attention. Since then, hundreds of children have been killed, thousands have been abducted or forcibly recruited by armed groups, and more than 800,000 children have been forced to flee their homes. In recent months, the violence in north-east Nigeria has increased. The number of children running for their lives within Nigeria, or crossing over the border to Chad, Niger and Cameroon, has more than doubled in the past year. Children are in danger like never before. Many children have been traumatized by what they have experienced. Over the past months, our organization has provided more than 2,000 children at Mararaba Primary School, near Abuja with writing desks and psychological support to help ease the pain and cope with emotional distress. We are also working to provide clean water, nutrition and education to children affected by the conflict in the northern part of Nigeria, Dr. Prince of PROFOH has made several visit to Internally Displaced Persons camp. We call on the Nigeria Government to do everything in its power to bring back the Chibok girls.
