Dear Members,

Reflecting on the past year, I am deeply proud of our organizational efforts in the face of COVID-19 as we continuously service humanity. We have succeeded in delivering lifesaving medical and surgical care, and responded to unexpected circumstances while operating, hence keeping our work centered on patients' health and their well-being, education, potable water and poverty reduction activities.

With the support of our strategic partners, and the prudent leadership of our Executive Director Gbemuotor Kama, Professionals for Humanity (PROFOH), had its last mission on New Year's Eve, the 31st of December, so that the total reached beneficiaries in 2021 totaled 20,000 covering consultations and treatments. PROFOH also signed a partnership and collaboration MOU with more than 10 international organizations while most of them are from the United States, we equally have organizations from Kenya, United Kingdom, China, Benin, Cameroon, Sweden, etc., to promote public health, combat cervical and breast cancer head-on. In this report, you will see public health accomplishments in medical missions and also ways in which PROFOH teams innovated and adapted to an ever-changing public health space across all the countries where we operate, and hopefully, inspire.

As Board Chair, I commend and deeply appreciate the scaled-up collaborative efforts of some United Nations with PROFOH, namely: the WHO TB Partnership, UN DESA, and the United Nations Disaster Risk Reduction (UNDRR) that specifically invited PROFOH to submit a paper on "Climate Change and Health: Insight into a Healthy, Sustainable and Resilient Future" for submissions in June 2022 for a global summit later in the year.

Every day, I am heartened by the hard work and dedication of PROFOH members around the world. Thank you all for your unwavering commitment and support in serving humanity, in moments of crisis and celebration, as we work toward a more just and equitable world. Thank you for accompanying us along this journey.

4. Relocation of our global headquarters from Texas to Washington DC with our organization Operational Control & Command Center will be base in the United Arab Emirate or any of the GCC nations.

The coming year offers many important opportunities for our organization and breakthroughs in Health, Education, Water and Poverty reduction activities. The G20 meeting in 2022 will be hosted by Indonesia, and we can be confident that our organization mission of supporting weak and compromised communities globally to overcome Health, Education, Safe drinking water and social challenges arising from poverty, and man-made or natural disasters will be at the top of the G20 agenda. Furthermore, the world will also convene at the United Nations Headquarters in September 2022 to discuss the future of education, a topic dear to the heart of PROFOH, and in which we plan to make an important contribution in the lead to the global gathering.

We will continue our pivotal work on the "Four Transformers" (Education, Health, Water and Social Upliftment). The organization will continue our varied efforts to promote global quality public health delivery, advance education, safe drinking water and poverty reduction activities across all countries. **Please accept my sincere gratitude for all that you do. The challenges of PROFOH mission are neither small, nor easy.** The victories are hard won. Yet step by step we are now becoming a global body in content and delivery, as planning and discussions are in advance stage to get PROFOH incorporated in India, Cameroon, UAE, The Netherlands and Australia, again including the relocation of our headquarters.

Finally, in less than 20 months we will celebrate our 25 years of existence, I look forward to working side by side with all of you in the 2022 and continue working together on our ever-more important efforts on enhancing human lives by living up to our name - **PROFOH as Professionals for Humanity.**

ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF THE YEAR AT A GLANCE

OVERVIEW:

PROFOH was founded in the middle of Jesse fire disasters that claimed over 1000 lives in October 1998, as a non-profit organization. The organization is now officially incorporated in the following countries, countries: United States, Nigeria, Germany, Ghana, Ireland, Jamaica, Nepal and South Africa. while having presence in 15 other nations. it has helped to advance public health, education, provided safe drinking water and reduced poverty in several communities globally;

KEY ACCOMPLISHMENTS:

- ❖ Together with our strategic partner organizations we successfully conducted six missions, four in Nigeria, one in Uganda, one in Egypt, one is currently ongoing at St, Mary Catholic Hospital, Akwa Ibom, Nigeria led by Dr. Brian Camazine
- ❖ Expanded our You are not Alone program in Ireland with our great partners Women of Essence and RCCG both are based in Ireland, the program is a Food Bank, where groceries are given to different communities, the homeless and those economically weak. PROFOH and partners intend to expand the program to the UK and other European countries in the near future,
- ❖ Conducted Education missions in Nepal and Ghana, co-sponsored the Nigeria Federal University of Petroleum Resources (FUPRE) Education RoundTable.
- ❖ PROFOH commenced discussions with World Malaria Program (WMP) They regularly engages and shares information with governments and public health agencies in Africa; however, they are not currently working with any countries in Africa. PROFOH is very likely going to be the gateway to Africa. If there is a government interest from countries that had a significant burden, then WMP would welcome the opportunity to share information to discuss a possible plan.
- ❖ Attended numerous International Conferences and summits held in United Kingdom, South Korea, Canada, etc.
- ❖ Pioneering new public health approaches to preventing and controlling health-based interventions for the devastated, neglected communities in some Africa Countries including the establishment village-based health interventions in Nigeria.
- ❖ Advancing efforts to improve mental health care and diminish stigma for people that are mentally challenged.
- ❖ Got into global visibility with few of the United Nations agencies scaled up PROFOH's engagement and collaboration, recently the United Nations Disaster Risk Reduction (**UNDRR**) have specifically invited PROFOH to submit a paper for a Special Issue on "Climate Change and Health: Insight into a Healthy, Sustainable and Resilient Future" Deadline set by the UNDRR for manuscript submissions: 18 June 2022.

WORLD TB DAY:

PROFOH is a leading member of the World Health Organization - **WHO STOP TB-Partnership**. TB is a disease of poverty, it spreads like wildfire through places where nutrition is poor, living conditions are overcrowded, and treatment doesn't exist—infesting and killing millions of people in the poor nations where we work. Last year we promised to do better, with all sense of modesty, we did much better in terms of participants. PROFOH also issued a press statement to mark the day.

DELEGATION EVENTS:

- Attended the Canadian Conference on Global Health (CCGH) which took place in Ottawa, Canada. The conference was organized by the Canadian Association for Global Health in partnership with the University of Health and Allied Sciences, Ghana. The theme of the Conference was "Rethinking Partnership Paradigms in Global Health.", the program was excellent with over 800 delegates from 62 countries.

A reflection by Innocent Ntaganira following his participation at the #CCGH2021

I just attended the Canadian Conference on Global Health (CCGH) which took place from 24-26 November 2021 in Ottawa, Canada. The conference was organized by the Canadian Association for Global Health in partnership with the University of Health and Allied Sciences, Ghana. The theme of the Conference was "Rethinking Partnership Paradigms in Global Health". This was the first conference I was attending since I moved to Canada at the end of June 2021, when I retired from the World Health Organization after 38 years in public health including 19 years with the World Health Organization.

I was struck by the "humility tone " that was reflected in the discussions throughout the conference. Humility in reflecting on the current status of health partnerships between the "Global North" and the "Global South"; Humility in the discussions around issues of power differentials, equity, fairness in the partnership practices. There was an explicit call for a paradigm shift, a change in the narratives, and a rethinking of the vocabulary used to define the relations between the global health partners in the North and the South.

The theme of decolonizing Global Health was very present in the discussions. It is encouraging to see that this debate is taking place in the Global North and I do hope the discussions are also taking place in global health circles in Low and Middle Income countries of the Global South. Rethinking partnership paradigms does not only apply to Global Health, but the Global Health community could definitely play a catalyzing role in reshaping engagement modalities between the Global North and partners in the South. And everybody has got a role to play in this. At the end of the day, it is going to be the sum of efforts that shall make a difference.

Coming from the Global South and Living in the Global North is an opportunity to provide my modest contribution to the many efforts done to reshape those engagement modalities. This shall be done through inputs into Global Health debates and actions, sharing real-life experiences, and facilitating win-win partnerships between institutions and organizations.

At the end of the Canadian Conference on Global Health, a Canadian colleague whom I very much respect asked me what was my take-home message. I said that I was very much impressed by the humility tone of the discussions. And her reaction was like " That is Canada"

- PROFOH attended the United Nations; The Future of Trust in Government: UN DESA Global Policy Dialogue. As the world continues to deal with the dual challenges of climate change and the COVID-19 pandemic, UN DESA is gathering high-level speakers to consider how governments can develop better relationships with people, build the trust necessary to tackle present challenges and act now to reduce future disaster risks. This is the fourth event in a series of six "Future of the World" policy dialogues coordinated by UN DESA.
- PROFOH attended the 2021 OGP Global Summit The agenda featured 280 speakers, including 14 Heads of State and Government, across 40 plenaries and main sessions, and more than 50 sessions hosted by our partners. This 10th anniversary Summit was a crucial opportunity to reinforce the importance of open government in recovering from the pandemic, countering the 15-year-trend of rising authoritarianism, and strengthening and renewing democracy.
- PROFOH attended the Reuters Next, it was most important global gathering of leaders and forward thinkers coming together to drive action and accelerate a new approach to the challenges we face besides COP 26 in Glasgow. MEDICAL MISSIONS

Dr. Stuart Quartemont Mission.

AUGUST 2021: Dr. Stuart Quartemont, Chair of PROFOH Advisory Board and President Medical Mission International (MMI), a professor of family medicine and general surgery led a seven-member team to Kaduna. PROFOH and MMI have been long standing partners. We are glad to inform you that the mission was successful as over 200 patients benefited from the intervention. According to Dr. Quartemont there were initial setbacks, as one of our surgeons tested positive for COVID 19 and could not make the trip. Another nurse pulled out for other reasons; Dr. Kurt Davis Son was not allowed under Business visa. In spite of these setbacks, we had a great team, with three surgeons: Dr. Mark Frakes, Dr. Kurt Davis and me. We also had a nurse, Danielle Batchelor, and three returning missionaries: Pierre Moranza, Phyllis Riddle and Velvet Quartemont. The team were able to performed bold **56 surgeries** in 11 work days and over **150 patients** were seen. We prayed for all of them, even our Muslims brothers and sisters who comprised half of our surgical cases were very generous. Several media sources interviewed us for television because a local Imam had referred so many patients to us! We had the pleasure of spending four days in Port Harcourt, Rivers State-South South Nigeria where Velvet and I had spent a year as missionaries in 1988-89. On this visit, we were treated like royalty, as we spent several days with our friend, Canis, doing surgery and consulting at Canyrich Fountain Mission Hospital

NOVEMBER 2021: PROFOH in partnership with Check Medical Missions conducted an extremely impactful mission in Ogbomosho, Oyo State, South West Nigeria about 250 kilometers from Lagos. We have had two missions in this ancient city in some years ago, one at the Bowen University Teaching Hospital and the other was the newly constructed Health care center. The Kabieyese (King) of the city Onipetu of Ijeru is one of PROFOH Nigeria patron, he was instrumental in all the mission conducted in his kingdom a strong believer of quality public health, he said for his people Standard of living to increase they have to be healthy. Our team led by Ms. Success Efezino and Adeola Yusuf made PROFOH proud the report from the Royal Palace was very kind, with **138 surgeries performed**, 1654 had consultations and treatments, 404 Children were deworming of children 404, while Physiotherapy 93. The total of **3468 patients benefited**.

The mission enjoyed some level of support from the Rivers State Ministry of Health and Human Services and a major telecommunication service provider with chairs, canopies and tables. The mission is a direct result of the community advancement in cultural development for their yearly EYAAL IINMENIAN FESTIVAL, Abua Central. By the time the mission was **over 3415 patients benefited**. It also on record that the medical mission ran into the nights, PROFOH has conducted about ten medical missions in Rivers State over the years.

DECEMBER 2021: PROFOH and our strategic partner Medaid United Kingdom had a monumental medical mission in Alemere community in Amolater District in North Uganda for two weeks, it was comprehensive mission it included 1050 COVID 19 Vaccination, **187 surgeries** performed, 215 Consultations and treatments, 18 Anti natal care, 348 post-natal care, 442 Immunization of kids under 5 years, 366 Malaria Control Program. The total of **3068 patients benefited**, another mission has been scheduled for 2022. Our partner, Medaid United Kingdom built Adwir Community Health Centre (100 beds) in Alebtong district Northern Uganda in 2001 and Alemere community where this mission took place was built by MedAid in 2002. We are currently running Alemere Medical Aid Uganda Community Health Centre. The medical facility currently has been upgraded to health center III with 30 beds capacity and Medical Diagnostic facilities. The plan is to upgrade Alemere Medical Aid Uganda Community Health Centre III to a teaching hospital specializing in maternal child healthcare and cancer screening and treatment hospital with support from PROFOH.



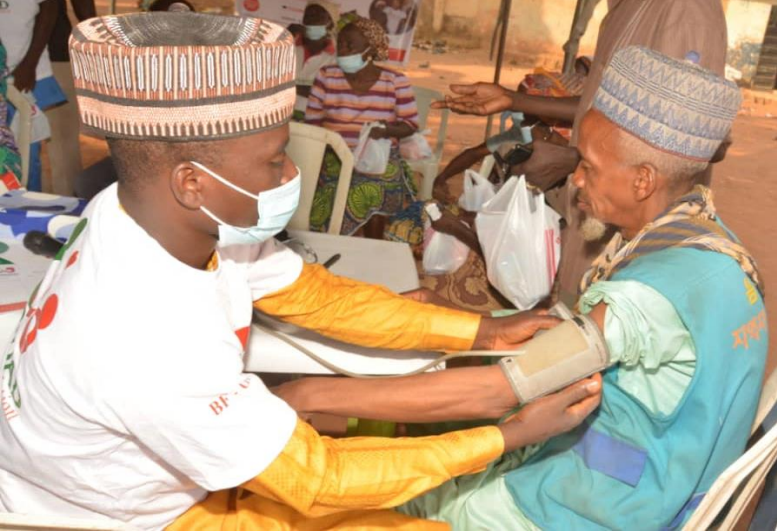

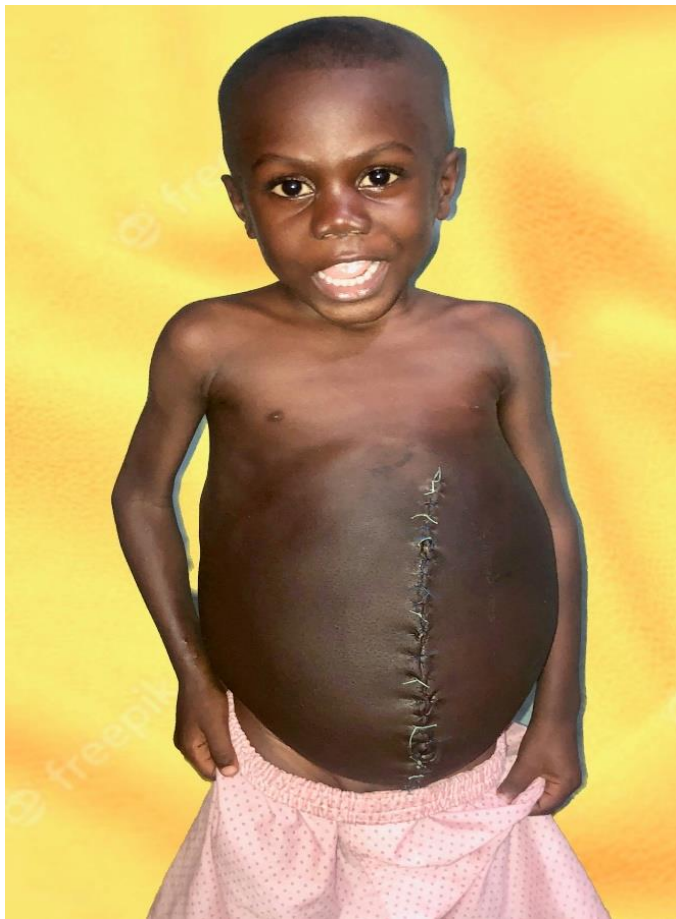
BRIAN CAMAZINE ON GOING SURGERY IN NIGERIA

Performed surgery in FCT, Delta, Abia, Rivers, Akwa Ibom States. During these years, 25 eventful trips, thousands of Nigerian upper-level healthcare workers participated, and they acquired valuable experience and exposure to handle complex surgical cases. Camazine hospital location within Nigeria has been a medical Mecca for doctors, nurses, healthcare workers and medical students, including senior consultants from government-owned medical facilities. This aspect of the trip is quite unique and Surgeon is very happy to get such a strong local participation. The mandate of ESF is also provide education and manpower development. The next medical mission from him is schedule to take place in Q2 2022. He has graciously agreed to repeat history with our organization -joint medical mission between PROFOH and ESF, exactly what we did in Terabor, Gokana in Rivers State some years ago where we broke our records, by performing 25 bold surgeries in one single day. The Chair, Board and members of PROFOH express their profound gratitude to Dr. Camazine for his amazing dedication and call to serve. According to Dr. Brian Camazine...If a surgeon does **400 cases a year for 25 years**, he helps 10,000 people. If he trains just 10 surgeons in his lifetime, he helps 100,000 people. Every surgeon was a pain in the neck to train (especially me) so we all have an obligation to pass our knowledge to others.

NEPAL EMERGENCY EDUCATION INTERVENTION

PROFOH have been providing support and emergency education classrooms in Kathmandu Nepal, in the past, it was Kathmandu, this year is Bara, a remote village of Sarlahi District South of Kathmandu a little over 120 kilometers from the Nepalese Capital According to our country director the village is very backward with only one school, no single hospital, there was no evidence of COVID 19, sanitizers, face masks, etc. Our team was able to address and rolled back some of the educational setbacks for the kids.

FEMALE EDUCATION PROJECT

PROFOH is a member of several international groups promoting and advancing quality education globally, including International Network for Education in Emergencies, which has inspired our education interventions during our medical missions, in the past, offered several scholarships and provided writing desks to public school in Nigeria. In February, we conducted several educational missions in Nigeria and Ghana. Our Girl Child Education Project is still running we have received an official letter of letter of request from Katsina State Government in Northern Nigeria for assistance in distribution of reusable sanitary towels for female students in that state, other Nigerian states have also indicated high interest.

It Is a simple project but very impactful, girls in rural community across Africa are very disadvantaged due to their monthly menstrual period –they skip classes for a week some do during their examination period, some have suffered high level infection as a result of using piece of rags, lots of these young women we have treated during PROFOH medical missions. Our organization is pleased to note that some female political leaders are now showing interest, Example is the First Lady of Sierra Leone, distribution of washable sanitary pads in Freetown is her flagship project. PROFOH has conducted this mission in the past, the outcome was amazing, Girls Academic performances increase by almost 52%, as soon as the security situation in Katsina State normalizes we shall resume of distribution. The unique aspect of our towels –they are clinically tested and washable and could be reusable for three years.

Water Mandate is working round the clock to ensure effective Water governance and global access to millions of people- its ironic that water covers over 70% of earth surface, yet nearly a billion people do not have access to this most important liquid to human. According to the United Nations over 700 million people around the world do not have access. In spite of remarkable progress of access to improved drinking water since 1990s, significant disparities persist, 90 per cent live in rural areas, and are being left behind in their countries progress. For children, lack of access to safe water can be tragic. On average, nearly 1,000 of them die every day from diarrheal diseases linked to unsafe drinking water, poor sanitation, or poor hygiene. For women and girls, collecting water cuts into time they can spend caring for families and studying. In insecure areas, it also puts them at risk of violence, rape and attack. UNICEF estimates that in Africa alone, people spent billions of hours every year just to walk and collect or buy water. Building on a successful roll-out last year, PROFOH, UNICEF and partners are again this year engaging the public campaign to help raise awareness. Our organization issued a Press Statement to mark the day.
